

If someone knocks on your door... Will you know what to do?

Be alert to people who show up uninvited at your doorstep.

Frequent scams include:

- A construction worker who promises to pave your driveway or re-roof your house with a "too good-to-be-true" price, often using leftover supplies from a nearby job.
- A salesperson who poses as someone from Medicare or another government agency to sell insurance or steal personal information like your Social Security number.
- Someone who asks for donations to a charity but cannot produce documentation to show they are affiliated with the charity.
- Someone who claims you are due for routine maintenance on your heater, or air conditioner (or something else), and wants a lot of money for "emergency" repairs.

Protect yourself with the following tips:

- Never let strangers into your home. Remember that no one from the government shows up "out of the blue."
- Shut the door if someone pitches a product you don't want.
- Call the police if someone refuses to leave or pressures you to buy.
- Verify that any repair or service people on your doorstep actually work for the company they represent.

Back up:

• If you buy something from a door-to-door salesperson and have second thoughts, you have three days to cancel for a full refund if you spent at least \$25 on the product or service. The seller must explain your cancellation rights at the time of the sale, provide you with two copies of a cancellation form, and give you a copy of the contract or receipt.

Don't invite problems by inviting a stranger in your home!
